ORDER

On November 6, 2008, the Honorable Thomas F. Hogan of this Court entered a case management order in the miscellaneous civil action captioned as In re Guantanamo Bay Litigation, Misc. No. 08-442 (TFH) (D.D.C.), as well as in the above-captioned cases (the “Case Management Order”). Shortly thereafter, the undersigned member of the Court entered an order amending that case management order in the cases assigned to this member of the Court (the “Amended Case Management Order”). When Judge Hogan entered a subsequent order staying

the Case Management Order in response to the motion for partial reconsideration filed by the respondents, the undersigned member of the Court followed suit by entering an order staying the Amended Case Management Order (the “Stay Order”). Aside from a still-pending motion by the petitioners in these cases to terminate the Court’s stay with respect to one aspect of the Amended Case Management Order, there has been no activity with respect to that motion since the entry of the Court’s Stay Order.

On December 16, 2008, Judge Hogan entered an order granting in part and denying in part the respondents’ motion for partial reconsideration, amending certain aspects of the Case Management Order, and terminating the stay of that order. Having carefully considered that order, and having carefully reviewed the undersigned member of the Court’s own Amended Case Management Order, it is apparent that the Amended Case Management Order must be vacated in its entirety and replaced with a new amended case management order that reflects the changes made by Judge Hogan to his original Case Management Order and facilitates the prompt and equitable resolution of the above-captioned cases. The prior Amended Case Management Order and Stay Order entered by this member of the Court will therefore be vacated, and the petitioners’ motion for partial relief from the Stay Order will be denied as moot.

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that the Court’s Amended Case Management Order entered on November 12, 2008, and the Court’s Stay Order entered on November 21, 2008, are **VACATED**. It is further

ORDERED that the petitioners’ motion to partially terminate the stay of the Court’s Amended Case Management Order is **DENIED** as moot.
